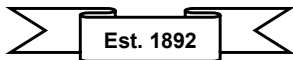


Snape & Well Show

Recipe for Tea Loaf – Class 810

250g mixed dried fruit, 100g dark brown sugar, 225ml strong hot black tea, pinch salt, ¼ tsp ground cinnamon, ¼ tsp ground nutmeg, 1 large egg (beaten), 250g self-raising flour.

METHOD

Put the dried fruit and sugar into a heatproof mixing bowl and add the tea. Leave overnight to soak.

Heat the oven to 160°C/325°F/Gas 3. Grease and line 2lb loaf tin. Add the salt, spices, and egg to the soaked fruit. Stir well. Mix in the flour then pour into prepared tin. Bake for approximately 1 hour.
